This two-part roundtable considers the complicated legacies of the Yanomamö Film Series (1969–1976), which emerged from a collaboration between anthropologist Napoleon Chagnon (1938–2019), filmmaker Tim Asch (1932–1994), and Yanomamö communities in southern Venezuela and northern Brazil. Distributed by Documentary Education Resources (DER) and archived in the Smithsonian's National Anthropological Archive, the series is a groundbreaking ethnographic media project that expanded the boundaries of documentary. The first roundtable is focused on the technical and aesthetic issues underlying the processes of preservation and digital restoration. The second panel explores the value of these films for the Yanomamö and anthropologists interested in more equitable collaborations.
